



Je suis plus petit(e) que mon professeur




Mes cours d'anglais sont plus intéressants

### ENGLISH

My teacher is tallER THAN me

I am shortER THAN my teacher

My English classes are MORE interesting  
THAN my French class.

My French classes are longER THAN my  
English classes

Dogs are often happIER THAN cats.

Cats are often calmER THAN dogs.

#### What is the structure in French for comparing?

1. plus + adjective + que

#### What are the structures in English for comparing?

1. adjective + er+ than
  2. more + adjective + than
- adjective adds er if 1 syllable  
-adjective usually stays the same if 2+ syllables but  
adjectives that end in Y change Y to I and add er

#### WHAT ARE THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN ENGLISH AND FRENCH WHEN WE MAKE COMPARISONS?

1. French adjectives DO NOT change to make a comparison though they have masculine and féminine forms. English adjectives DO change sometimes, depending on number of syllables.
2. In French, PLUS always come before the adjective. In English, MORE sometimes comes before the adjective.
